Periodic Assessments

- 1. **Periodic Assessment**: It is conducted for all core subjects one each in each term.
- 2. Multiple Assessments: They are conducted as per the given schedule from time to time.
 - a. Languages: ASL, Creative Writing, etc.
 - b. Mathematics: Mathematics Lab Activities & Mental Ability
 - c. Science: Science Practical & Journal, Project Work, Quiz, etc.
 - d. Social Science: Map Work, Project Work, Quiz, etc.
 - e. Half Yearly Examination is included in the Periodic Assessment in the Weightage of Marks.
- **3. Portfolio**: Assessing Portfolios Students' portfolio can be effectively evaluated using a simple scoring rubric. The criteria the factors to be used in determining the quality of a particular student's portfolio is shared with students such as:
 - Organization Neatness, Creativity and Visual Appeal
 - Completion of guided work focused on specific curricular objectives
 - Evidences of student's growth
 - Inclusion of all relevant work (Completeness).

Teachers can include other subject relevant criteria and elements to assess portfolios.

4. Subject Enrichment Activity: It can be taken in the form of Assignment, presentation of papers, Worksheets, Art Integrated Activities.

B. Co Scholastic Areas:

- 1. Art Education: a) Drawing, Painting & Craft, b) Music c) Reading, Library, General Knowledge, c) Value Education, Cultural heritage, Folklore, Ancient History, etc.
- 2. Health and Physical Education: a) PE, Yoga, Scouts & Guides, etc.
- **3. Work Experience**: a) IT, b) Seva, etc.

Pen Paper Assessment/Exam: Periodic Assessment, Annual Examination comes under this category.

Project Work: All projects are given in writing in a standard proforma along with guidelines. Projects must be research based. Students must cite the sources of reference on the last page. Project work must be done by students only. However, they can seek the help of Teachers.

Date sheet: The date sheet of Periodic Assessment and Annual Examination is given 15 days prior on E-Campus Circular. There is no date sheet for Multiple Assessments. However, teachers will give an approximate period of such assessments or submissions.

Syllabus for Periodic Assessment & Annual Examination: Syllabus of the Periodic Assessment, Annual Examinations is given 15 days prior on E-Campus Circular.

Report Card: The Report Card is students' performance record in Scholastic A & B & Co-Scholastic areas, etc. Report cards are issued after the end of First Term and at the end of Second Term.

Long Reading Material: Students must read at least one-story book/novel in each term. It is part of their supplementary reading.
